Principles: Live by your principles. Conduct yourself accordingly at all times. Establish essential qualities of self to live by. Develop within yourself matters of Moral Principle.

Advancement: Always keep advancing towards your goals and desired achievements. Gain your momentum and be continuous in your efforts. Let Victory be your shining destiny.

Chivalry: Be chivalrous when the opportunity arises; likened to a gallant deed, the sum of the ideal qualifications of a knight, including courtesy, generosity, valor, and dexterity, demonstration of courtesy and politeness.
